# A LOOK BACK AT 2023

#### By Dr. Jared Robins, ASRM CEO

This past year, ASRM made amazing strides in advancing its strategic plan, which focused on membership, research, advocacy, patients, and organizational sustainability. ASRM created member value by completing a multi-year project to re-launch ASRM.org to be more user and mobile-friendly, as well as fully searchable. We welcome your feedback about ways to continue to evolve and improve our website.

Dr. Michael Thomas, 2022-2023 ASRM President, focused on developing the pipeline of practitioners in reproductive medicine. At ASRM 2023, we debuted the KEEPR program to 120 registered residents, who attended the meeting and learned about REI through hands-on instruction, specialized lectures, and interaction with leaders in our field. ASRM also expanded the Career Pathways Program, which facilitates awareness of reproductive health, medicine, and science professions, while creating a network of mentors to support under-represented individuals interested in a career in our field. At the 2023 Congress, 12 medical students and 18 undergraduate students participated in the program.

Pipeline development also focused on ASRM's newly formed and fast-growing Advanced Practice Provider (APP) Professional Group. ASRM hosted a physician-APP summit in Nashville, TN, during which, select physicians and APPs brainstormed ways to incorporate APPs in reproductive medicine clinical practices. As a result, ASRM will develop a series of educational materials and opportunities to help its members develop APPs, including a white paper to be published in 2024.

Pipeline was also a focus in the area of research. ASRM partnered with the Society for the Study of Reproduction (SSR) to launch the new SPARK Initiative, a program that elevates translational research by providing a platform for basic scientists and clinicians to collaborate. ASRM also helps develop young researchers by fully supporting two Reproductive Scientist Development Program (RSDP) scholars, the second of which was added in 2023. The ASRM Research Institute continues to grow its endowment and partner with donors and industry to support pilot grants to help young investigators launch their research careers and to help established researchers support their efforts.

The Center for Policy and Leadership (CPL), a nonpartisan think-tank on reproductive policy, had much success in 2023, with CPL Director Rebecca O'Connor, JD, participating in a Yale University expert convening on the politics and ethics of gamete regulation; developing reports and resources for decisionmakers; and presenting at conferences, including the ARM & NPG Joint Meeting. This work clearly establishes ASRM's CPL as a major source of reproductive information for policymakers.

The culmination of 2023 was ASRM's release of its new and inclusive definition of infertility, which affirms that infertility includes "the need for medical intervention, including, but not limited to, the use of donor gametes or donor embryos in order to achieve a successful pregnancy either as an individual or with a partner." This bold new definition is supportive of ASRM's vision to be the national and international leader in the fertility field with the goal of ensuring accessible, ethical, and quality reproductive care for every person.

We are proud of our 2023 successes and want to thank our board of directors for providing vision and guidance, the incredible ASRM staff that accomplishes amazing feats despite its small size, and the phenomenal ASRM volunteers, who spend hours of their personal time working for our important mission. 

- The forming Hispanic SIG conducted its first official members' meeting during the ASRM Scientific Congress & Expo in New Orleans.



- ASRM was thrilled that fertility preservation mandates became law in Texas, Montana, and Kentucky. Additionally, ASRM supported an IVF and fertility preservation insurance mandate for the large group insurance market in Washington, DC, which is expected to be enacted in 2025.
- To support Ohio's ballot measure that codified the right to abortion, contraception, and fertility care in the state, ASRM hosted a podcast with advocates, bought radio ads throughout the state, and ASRM members sent 300 postcards to voters urging them to vote yes.
- Consistent advocacy over the past few years has led to expanded fertility coverage benefits for Federal Employee Health Benefits (FEHB) program enrollees. In 2024, federal health plans are now required to cover artificial insemination procedures and medications, as well as the drugs for three cycles of IVF annually. Also, there are 24 health plan options that provide broader services, some including IVF.


# 2023 Highlights

- The CPL, in partnership with the law firm of Hogan Lovells, LLP, released a series of reports evaluating the import of the Supreme Court's landmark Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision on reproductive health care.
- The CPL launched the **PRIMED** (Preparing Experts in Reproductive Medicine to Engage Decisionmakers) Scholars advocacy training program. In early 2024, the first cohort of PRIMED scholars will embark on an in-depth course on the fundamentals of policymaking, persuasive communications, and grassroots engagement.
- **CPL** Director Becca O'Connor presented at and participated in several external convenings, including a multidisciplinary Yale University Symposium and the ARM/NPG Joint Meeting.

# 2023 F&S Highlights

- The Impact Factor for *Fertility and Sterility* is 6.7, ranking it 6 out of 85 in the Obstetrics and Gynecology category and 3 out of 31 in Reproductive Biology. The five-year Impact Factor is 7.5, ranking it 5th in Obstetrics and Gynecology and 3rd in Reproductive Biology.
- The Fertility and Sterility On Air Podcast released 29 episodes in 2023, was downloaded 39,948 times, and was listened to in 129 countries.
- Twelve Journal Club Global events were broadcast from locations around the globe, including Mexico, Australia, Turkey, France, and Argentina, and many meetings in the US, including ASRM, MRSi, PCRS, and the SREI Fellows Retreat. There were 817 online participants, many live audience members, and over 2,000 views of the archived videos.
- Three special issues were released covering important topics in the field with invited pieces authored by subject experts: Reproduction as the Foundation for a Healthy Society; Gonadotropin Releasing Hormone: 50 Years of Innovation; and Genetics of the Preimplantation Embryo.


ASRM has seen continued development and growth of industry engagement, support, and collaboration. Highlights from 2023 include:





Although we are thankfully emerging from a global pandemic, it is clear that the world still faces many challenges. In our own field,

we continue to see government efforts to interfere in the practice of medicine and the doctor-patient relationship. There are continued efforts to deny women abortion care and adults and youth genderaffirming care.

We are beginning to see pushback to DEI efforts in academia and elsewhere. At ASRM, we remain undeterred and steadfast in our commitment to these values. Continuing the efforts of Past President Dr. Michael Thomas, who made DEI a central focus of his term, we are working to diversify our membership, leadership, and staff. As an organization, we are committed to addressing and reducing health disparities.

The landscape of our practice is also being shaped by the transformative forces of AI and private equity. As we've seen in other health sectors, these changes can positively and negatively impact our field. We remain focused on patient safety, outcomes, patient satisfaction, and equitable access to care.

Recently, ASRM announced a new, more inclusive definition of infertility, which includes single persons and same-sex couples, who often need assisted reproduction to build their families. expected to release its report later this year. We look forward to their recommendations.

 Annual Meeting in Denver: We are putting together an exciting program for the annual meeting in October focused on the theme of "Equity, Access, and Innovation."

Although the economic forecast remains uncertain, ASRM is financially healthy, allowing us to support our strategic initiatives. In a future post, I plan to invite our Treasurer, Jessica Spencer, and CFO, Dan Carre, to give a more detailed picture of ASRM's finances.

Additionally, I look forward to welcoming our Director of Charitable Giving, Holly Jaap Hilton, to talk about cultivating a culture of giving at ASRM.
